## ABLE TO TEACH

IMPARTED TO YOU BY A TEACHER.
<b>Titus 1:9:</b> [A leader] must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it.
Throughout Christian history, the qualifications we're discussing this semester have been used specifically in the context of pastoral leadership.  But being able to teach is a requirement of all Christians worthy of honor and respect.  Being able to teach is not limited to public speaking abilities, being able to turn a phrase, or having the gift of gab. Paul is much more concerned about is taught, rather than it is taught.  Some of the best lessons are not taught in classrooms; they're taught at dinner tables, over the phone, in board rooms, on the job.
<ul> <li>James 3.1: Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness.</li> <li>1 Timothy 5.17: Let the elders who rule well be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in preaching and teaching.</li> </ul>
THE PURPOSE OF TEACHING:
A. WE TEACH TO IMPART
Paul speaks specifically of our ability to teach the basic tenets of our faith.
Matthew 28.18: And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
Part of the Great Commission is to teach. But you cannot teach what you do not know. A good teacher must first be a good  Only 5% of Americans are "Bible Centered," meaning they interact with the Bible frequently, it transforms their relationships, and shapes their choices.
B. WE TEACH TO PASS ON
The best teachers are not the ones that are the most intelligent. The best teachers are those who exemplify honor, respect, and integrity. The old adage is true: People don't care how much you know until they know how much you

<b>Maya Angelou:</b> I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel.
As Christians, we must continually teach values to the next generation. Values of integrity, honesty, freedom, love, self-denial, generosity, and kindness. Christianity is always one generation away from
Romans 10.14: But how can they call on him to save them unless they believe in him? And how can they believe in him if they have never heard about him? And how can they hear about him unless someone tells them?
C. WE TEACH TO CORRECT
A heresy is a teaching or idea that runs contrary to orthodoxy. In the days of the New Testament, heresy was rampant. Paul warns the young churches to teach the true, orthodox faith.
1 Timothy 4.1-2: Now the Spirit expressly says that in later times some will depart from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons, through the insincerity of liars whose consciences are seared.
What was true about heretics in the days of the New Testament is true of heretics now: They are persuasive, they can draw a crowd, and what they say might not sound too outlandish.
1 Peter 3.15: In your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and
MODERN HERESIES WE SHOULD CORRECT
1. THE HERESY OF
Modernism believed that we should move away from allowing religious perspectives to ground our knowledge and understanding of the world. These thinkers wanted to wipe clean our religious understanding and instead start from a blank slate to explain reality. They believed that complete objectivity was possible.
Post-Modernism rejects these ideas. It says that there is no such thing as truth.
What was once confined to the halls of philosophy departments has now made its way

These heresies will arise in culture, in your family, in your workplace. The question is: Will you be bold enough to combat them?

When we teach the Gospel, when we teach the truths of the Bible, we don't just combat heresies, impart information, or pass on values: we acknowledge that our faith is not just about us. It's about our family, our children, those who do not know Jesus. Being able to teach shows that you take your faith seriously.
